TEN SLEEP FFA CHAPTER MEMBER WINS STATE FFA CHAMPIONSHIP



CHEYENNE— Madison Anderson of the Ten Sleep FFA Chapter in was named Wyoming’s top speaker in the 2014 Creed Speaking Career Development Event on April 9, 2014, at the Wyoming FFA State Convention in Cheyenne.

The Creed Speaking competition is designed to recognize outstanding FFA members for their ability to present the National FFA Creed in a competitive setting. Members deliver the creed from memory and respond to three questions. The event gives FFA members the opportunity to develop their ability to communicate in a powerful, organized and professional manner.

Anderson said it took her a little more than a month to memorize and perfect her delivery of the creed.

“My ag advisor made me give the creed in front of the whole class for the first time which was kind of scary,” she explained. “It was not my favorite thing in the world. I gave it five times a day during third and sixth period, just over and over again. I gave it to our school and individual classes throughout the day.”

Anderson was coached by Jarred Bower, Ten Sleep FFA Advisor.
